



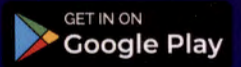

Community Safety & Well-being Branch



Using intelligence, data, and analytics, CS&WB is leading our policing response in Alberta through education, prevention, intervention and enforcement.

Virtual Opioid Dependency Program



The Alberta RCMP has partnered with Alberta Health Services and local pharmacies across Alberta to take part in the Virtual Opioid Dependence Program (VODP). The VODP provides Albertans who are struggling with drug addiction access to counselling and medical care to help them overcome their addiction.

School Resource Officer/Liaison Program



School Resource Officers (SRO) and School Liaison Officers (SLO) bridge the gap between youth and police. SROs and SLOs have a very specific skillset. They must be able to relate to youth, be open and approachable, act as a mentor, be a positive influence, and think outside the box.

Integrated Offender Management



The Integrated Offender Management Initiative looks at the person behind crimes to develop strategies that help to break the cycle of criminality. The Alberta RCMP

utilizes a wrap-around approach involving community leaders, social and health services and the justice system to better connect habitual offenders with the tools and resources they need to get themselves out of the life of crime.



Project Lock Up



Project Lock Up is an Alberta RCMP initiative, delivered in collaboration with law enforcement partners and citizen-led groups, addressing the needs of the people and the areas hit hardest by property crime.



Crime Academy



The RCMP have created a Crime Academy for people to help mitigate the risks of becoming victims of crime.



Data 2 Action



Data 2 Action is an Alberta RCMP Crime Reduction Strategy initiative that turns data and intelligence into actionable tasks focused on the four pillars of policing. The framework is designed to bring RCMP resources and supports alongside external partners across the province to tackle crime.

Regional Police and Crisis Teams



Regional Police and Crisis Teams consist of a police officer and mental health worker from Alberta Health Services who together intervene, assess, and support individuals in the community who are experiencing a mental health crisis. They provide onsite mental health assessments; appropriate referrals to community agencies; short-term follow-ups; assistance with apprehensions due to mental health crisis; and mental health education to other police officers and service providers, and the community.

Call Back Unit and Online Crime Reporting



The Call Back Unit (CBU) is an essential team designed to help Albertans, and improve response times of our members to calls for service across the province. Working closely with 911 dispatchers in the Operational Communications Centres, members from the CBU address non-emergency calls so front-line officers can take care of more urgent matters in person.

The CBU is also responsible for all of the reports that come through the online crime reporting system. Albertans can access the online crime reporting system 24/7 to report non-emergency crimes.

Crime Reduction Unit



Crime Reduction Units are comprised of regular members, analysts, and clerks at the district and detachment levels. They target priority offenders and address repeat crime trends to reduce impact of crime in communities across Alberta.

Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design



Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) is a set of principles meant to reduce crime through the consideration of the design of a physical environment to ensure a property is protected. The purpose of CPTED is to make recommended adjustments to a home or business property to make yards and buildings less appealing to criminals.
